All applications for free school meals are now completed electronically online where you will usually get an instant decision.



To Apply:

Scan the barcode with your phone and it should take you straight to the free school meals online application.

Alternatively search "Free School Meals Wakefield Council" and click on the top result. Free school meals - Wakefield Council

You can also apply by going through your account on the Parent Portal. Please ensure all details are correct as this can delay the application process

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Throughout our writing, will be ensuring we will be focussing on using adjectives and adverbs to add more detail alongside learning how to edit work and improve our writing.

Maths

In maths we will be securing our calculation skills by adding and subtracting 2digit numbers. We will extend our understanding of place value and begin to explore numbers to 1000 showing an understanding of hundreds, tens and ones. We are also going to be working hard to learn our times table facts.

Science

In science we are learning about light! We will find out about different light sources and think about what light and dark actually are. We will explore how light travels and find out about reflection. We will explore opaque, translucent and transparent materials.


Reading

we will be reading the story 'The Iron Man.' We will be developing our reading fluency to enable us to read in a more engaging manner. We will also we working on improving our vocabulary and visualisation skills in order to better understand the books we read.

At home...

Please encourage your children to use Times Table Rock Stars as much as possible at home. This will help to prepare them for the statutory multiplication test in Year 4.

Reading at home is also important to support your child's reading and writing skills.



Autumn One in Year 5



English

In English, we will be writing a recount of our trip to Grinton Lodge where we will be using time conjunctions as well as powerful vocabulary to describe our amazing time there.

We will also be using the book, 'The Wolves in the Walls' to support our reading work as well as our writing. We are looking forward to having a go at our own scary writing!

Maths

In Maths, we will be learning about positive and negative numbers and how to use these in real life contexts.

We will also be using written methods for multiplication and division and using this knowledge to solve a range of problems.

Science

Our Science topic this term is based on the theme of Solids, Liquids and Gasses. We will be learning about how states of matter can be changed using heating and cooling. We will also be learning about the properties of a range of materials and the similarities and differences between these.

We will be reading numerous texts this term including the book above. 'The Wolves in the Walls' tells the story of Lucy, who suspects that there are wolves living in her

Geography

DT

Music

We will be learning about North America this half term and will be comparing the physical and human geography of parts of North America with the UK. We will be improving our map reading skills and learning about the lines of longitude and latitude and we will be locating the tropics of Cancer and Capricorn and thinking about what the climate would be like in these zones.

In DT, we will be learning about different types of structures and why these are used in real life settings.

We will use a range of materials to build our own structures that are fit for a purpose. We will do this using a range of materials and joining techniques. We will be listening to a range of music genres this term and comparing these. We will learn how to give our views about music we are listening to.

We will also soon be learning Christmas songs ready for our Christmas performance.

PSHCE

Computing

In PSHCE we will be discussing the importance of celebrating our differences. We will be thinking about cultural differences and what these mean in our society as well as the many different types of family structures.

In Computing this term, we will be learning how to use Word to present. We will be thinking about how to alter fonts, how to centre sections of text as well as how to use the copy and paste functions to insert images into documents. We will also be learning how to move images around in a document and how to resize inserts.

PE

In PE, we will be developing our gymnastics skills as well as looking to develop our fitness.

We will be learning about balances as well as thinking about how we can develop our stamina and agility.

We will also be discussing why it is important to maintain good fitness levels.

We are focusing on place value of 7 and 8-digit numbers. We will add and subtract these numbers and practise crossing the millions boundary, looking at using place value strategies that will help with mental calculation. In the last few weeks we will move onto drawing and decomposing 2-D and 3D shapes. Alongside these, we will continue to practise key arithmetic skills for the CATS.

Science

This term it's all about STATES OF MATTER. We will look at what the states of matter are and investigate how or if the can change. We will look at chemical reactions and identify if the reactions are reversible or irreversible. This will lead us into identifying if all materials are the same and if Crystals can be made.

This half term we are focusing on DT skills. Please see below.

Music

We will travel to North America this half term. During our travel to North America, we will learn about which ocean separates us from North America and Compare our human and physical features.

The Children will identify key lines of longitude and latitude and how the weather can vary due to a Country's position along these lines.

We are identifying different type of structures 'shell structures' and 'frame structures'. We will identify how they have changed over history and how they can be made stronger using triangulation. The Children will design and build their own shelter structure for the wolves using the skills that they have learnt on how to make a strong structure using advances techniques.

We will learn about 'looping', starting off with body percussion. They will work in groups and individually to create their own looped rhythms. Then we will focus on our Christmas 'lip sync battle' by practising our chosen songs!

PSHE

Computing

We are learning about difference. The children will discuss what it means to be normal, what differences can look like and how everyone is an individual that should be celebrated.

We are learning how to make vector images using google drawings. We will look at how we can make a shape by building up lots of different shapes and add colour then learn how to save them.

PE

We are doing gymnastics and fitness this half term. Don't forget, the days are Wednesday and Friday.

The children will learn how to perform a range of rolls, shapes and ways to travel them work on putting these together.

We will test our muscle and Cardiovascular strength by Completing a range of fitness activities.

Autumn Two in Reception/Year 1

Physical Development

The children will be learning to use story talk. They will participate in role play activities and use role play during Child-initiated learning. Children will be learning new songs including our Nativity songs. The Children will be learning to show understanding when asked a question. They will listen to new vocabulary modelled to them and repeat it. Children will be learning to use new vocabulary in the right context with support from

adults.

Celebrations!

Children will be developing their confidence to initiate a conversation with familiar adults and peers. They will listen to a story and think about the feelings of the characters. The children are learning to follow school rules and routines and will learn how to be kind to others.

The children will be taking part in weekly Jigsaw lessons. This half term we will be exploring Celebrating Difference.

The children will be developing their gross motor skills with access to lots of outdoor provision. They will take part in weekly PE sessions where they will develop their fundamental movement skills such as balancing, hopping, jumping and Changing direction through the topic of 'Places and Spaces.'

Phonics

The Children will be taking part in daily Phonics sessions. The will be learning to recognise single sounds, special friends and to read words. They will write recognisable letters and begin to write CVC words.

Characteristics of Effective Learning

The Characteristics of learning describe behaviours the Children use to learn. To learn well, Children must approach opportunities with Curiosity, energy and enthusiasm. Effective learning must be meaningful to the Child, so that they are able to use what they have learnt and apply it in new situations. These abilities and attributes of strong learners will support them to learn well and make good progress in all the areas of learning and development.

Reception Maths

Year One Maths

We are Reading

In Maths this half term the children will continue to engage with activities that underline the purpose of counting – to find out 'how many' objects there are altogether. They will reinforce their understanding of Cardinality – that the last number in the count tells us 'how many' things there are altogether in a set of objects – and they will further practise their 1:1 Correspondence skill, by Counting numbers at the same time as moving or tagging objects. The children will also be continuing to learn how to subitise to 5 and compare different amounts.

In maths this half term, Year One children will be consolidating how to count forwards and backwards within 100 and how to count in 2s to 2o. Please continue to practise this at home.

They will learn how to use a part, part, whole model to partition numbers into two parts. They will begin to recall number facts to 5 and represent these on part, part, whole models and in expressions. They will learn how to find a missing part.

English

Reception children will be developing their listening and speaking skills through stories. They will be learning to answer how and why questions and use full sentences. Children will also be developing their fine motor skills to improve pencil control and letter formation. Year One children will be consolidating their formation of each letter, including capitals. They will develop their confidence at writing a dictated caption containing sounds that they already know.

Expressive Arts and Design

Design and Technology: The children will be learning about mechanism and will make a winter card with a moving part. Music: The children will be learning songs for our Christmas performance. The children will be experimenting with different percussion instruments.

Art: The Children will Continue to develop their Colour mixing

Understanding of the World

Science: The children will be learning that animals can have different diets – carnivore eats other animals, herbivore eats plants and omnivore eats both plants and animals.

History: The children will be learning the history behind Remembrance Day and how we celebrate it.

RE: The children will be learning about Diwali and Hanukkah. They will learn about the first Christmas and take part in Christmas activities.




